A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TEHAMA COUNTY IN PRESERVATION OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

"A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear arms, shall not be infringed."- U.S. CONST., Amendment II.

WHEREAS, the Tehama County Board of Supervisors intend that this resolution will support and defend the rights of the people as outlined in the Second Amendment for Tehama County's diverse community comprising people of various ethnic, religious, and political groups with a population of over 64,000 residents who may or may not choose to own a firearm; and

WHEREAS, the Tehama County Board of Supervisors acknowledges the Declaration of Independence as one of the foundational documents in the formation of the United States of America and affirms that all Tehama County residents "are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness..."; and

WHEREAS, we affirm that the U.S. Constitution was established by our founding fathers "to form a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty for ourselves and our posterity."; and

WHEREAS, the Tehama County Board of Supervisors acknowledges that the first ten Amendments to the U.S. Constitution are known as the Bill of Rights, and that support and defense of these rights were necessary for the ratification of the U.S. Constitution by the states. Therefore, the defense and preservation of these Amendments is still important today for all Tehama County residents.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Tehama County Board of Supervisors supports and defends the Second Amendment, as it is written and originally intended, for all Tehama County residents whether they choose to own a gun or not.
