Requested Action(s)

a) RESOLUTION - Request adoption of a resolution to amend the FY 2024-25 Personnel Allocation List (PAL), (Reso #2024-080), by adding one (1.00 FTE) Legal Secretary I/II/III, effective 10/22/24

Financial Impact:

This fiscal year, there is a salary savings of \$80,525.64 resulting from the unfilled Chief Deputy Public Guardian/Public Administrator position. Of this amount, \$34,300 will be allocated to fund the Legal Secretary I/II/III position, including onboarding expenses. Beginning in fiscal year 2025/2026, an allocation will need to be sourced from the general fund and/or other revenues generated by this department.

Background Information:

The Public Guardian / Public Administrator's office is requesting to add one (1.00 FTE) Legal Secretary I/II/III to the Department's Position Allocation List (PAL). Until recently, a Legal Secretary II within the Tehama County, County Counsel's Office performed duties on behalf of the PG/PA Department. These duties are now being transferred to the Department. As a result, the Department is requesting approval to add the new allocation.

The Joint Council Bargaining Unit has been notified of the changes and are in agreement.

Environmental Health Director Tia Branton explained the ordinance for the debris removal.

In response to Supervisor Moule, Ms. Branton discussed there are no exemptions for this since this is a state-run program that the debris still need to be cleaned up.
