



Palm quist doesn't even own the property mary hamilton, whose name is not on the deed, and the real owner of that property has never said anything.

This is really not about the road, it's about the fact that they don't want no one to use their creek.

The last five minutes of the c d that you just heard says that the county did not go by the law. When you put blocks in, you broke the law. That allowing the gates to stay. You are breaking the law. That the gates are illegal and it needs to be removed as well as the blocks.

Everyone tried to prosecute me to pay for the gate and also criminally. I was found not guilty of any crime. Now, The people that broke the law need to be cited. The gate on Farquhar is Still there, Palmquist and Garwood blocked it with logs and debris, so no one could even walk down. So cite them.

I'm formally informing the board of supervisors that I am filing charges to remove blockage, gates, and debris from the county road. That you should never have allowed up to begin with.


I told this board from the beginning that they were digging it up putting in suicide hills, and you say there's a two foot drop because they dug it up, so it wasn't passable on both sides.
