TEHAMA COUNTY CANCER PREVENTION COLLABORATIVE (TCCPC) EFFORTS TO DATE

April 2024: University of California Davis connected with University of California Agriculture and Natural Resources (UC ANR) based on concern of high cancer rates in the county.

July 2024: UC ANR started county focused conversations with Tehama County Health Services Agency Public Health to identify ways to address the concern. Timing was great as we had recently completed our Health Assessment and had concerns about rates. This kicked off a series of planning meetings with both Universities.

November 2024: Hosted first of two countywide dinner discussions with medical providers, clinics and the hospital to share data and identify patient trends, barriers and current screening practices.

March 2025: Hosted the second dinner to review health system data and identify a focus (Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine and Colon Cancer Screening).

March 2025-present: deeper dive via one-on-one meetings and key informant interviews with medical providers to better understand challenges and opportunities. Agreement on plan of direction and development of marketing and educational materials.
