BENEFITS

This position is an unrepresented position. Certain benefits contained in the Tehama County Management Employees' Association MOU apply:

- Approximately 80% of the premium for medical, dental, and vision plan is paid by the County. The current employee rate, as of January 2021, is \$193.93/mo. (EPO plan). The plan covers the employee and all eligible family members.
- \$100 per month communication allowance
- \$500 per month additional comp./travel allowance
- A generous retirement plan through the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS).
- An Employee Assistance Program is provided to all employees and employees' family members at no cost.
- A \$30,000 Life Insurance Plan for employees.
- A deferred compensation retirement savings plan is available to employees with a 2% deferred compensation contribution each pay period.



ABOUT THE POSITION

The Board of Supervisors is the governing body of the County and certain special districts. The Board enacts ordinances and resolutions, adopts the annual budget, approves contracts, appropriates funds, determines land use zoning for the unincorporated area, and appoints certain County officers, including the Chief Administrator and members of various boards and commissions.

This recruitment is for Tehama County District 1 Supervisor, and is an elected position. This appointment will hold office until the election and qualification of a successor. The appointed Board Member may run for an additional 2-year term starting at the June 2022 election, with a run-off election in November 2022, if necessary. The Board of Supervisors generally meets at 10 a.m. each Tuesday at the Tehama County Administrative Office located at 727 Oak Street, Red Bluff, CA.

ABOUT THE COUNTY

Tehama County is a charter county with a board-administrator form of government whose Chief Administrator is selected by a five member Board of Supervisors, who are elected at large. Each Board member serves a four year term. The Board of Supervisors governs Tehama County and is responsible for establishing the county budget and for executing all ordinances, resolutions and other legal actions that fall within the jurisdiction of Tehama County. The County has an operating budget of approximately \$223 million and approximately 907 allocated positions. On a regional level, the County provides services to anyone residing within the 3,000 square miles that comprise its legal boundaries.



ABOUT THE COMMUNITY

Nestled in the northern Sacramento Valley, Tehama County lies approximately midway between Sacramento and the Oregon border. The County sits alongside the beautiful Sacramento River and is only 50 miles West of Lassen National Park. Tehama County is the central point of widespread recreation; with nearby camping, hunting, fishing, golfing, snow skiing, and boating resources as good as or better than anywhere in California. Tehama County is home to approximately 65,000 people. In our County's small town atmosphere, you can experience the feeling of knowing your neighbors.
