

AMENDMENT #1

TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF TEHAMA AND UNITED WAY OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

This Amendment to Agreement #2021-268, dated October 19, 2021, by and between the County of Tehama, through its Health Services Agency (County) and United Way of Northern California (Contractor) for the provision of planning and systems development for a vaccine equity program, shall be amended as follows:

3. COMPENSATION

Contractor shall be paid in accordance with the rates set forth in the Fee Schedule, attached hereto as Exhibit "B" after satisfactorily completing the duties described in this Agreement. The Maximum Compensation payable under this Agreement shall not exceed \$130,000.00.

Contractor shall not be entitled to payment or reimbursement for any tasks or services performed except as specified herein. Contractor shall have no claim against County for payment of any compensation or reimbursement, of any kind whatsoever, for any service provided by Contractor after the expiration or other termination of this Agreement. Contractor shall not be paid any amount in excess of the Maximum Compensation amount set forth above, and Contractor agrees that County has no obligation, whatsoever, to compensate or reimburse Contractor for any expenses, direct or indirect costs, expenditures, or charges of any nature by Contractor that exceed the Maximum Compensation amount set forth above. Should Contractor receive any such payment it shall immediately notify County and shall immediately repay all such funds to County. This provision shall survive the expiration or other termination of this Agreement.

5. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement shall commence on January 1, 2021, and shall terminate June 30, 2024, unless terminated in accordance with section 6 below.

Exhibit B will be replaced in its entirety as set forth on pages 3-4 of this amendment.

It is mutually agreed that all other terms and conditions of Agreement #2021-268 shall remain in full force and effect.

Tehama County Public Health and UWNC Vaccine Equity Program

Contract Total \$130,000

January 2021- Extended to June 30, 2024

Amended Scope of Work

January – June 2021:

\$10,000

Planning and systems development to ensure equitable access to Covid-19 testing, vaccination and support services. UWNC will work to implement vaccine scheduling and education support through 211 and UWNC outreach services as directed by need and public health's guidance.

July 2021 – June 2022

\$30,000

\$20,000 Administration, 211 Services, Outreach and Education

July 2022 – June 2023

\$30,000

\$20,000 Administration, 211 Services, Outreach and Education

July 2023 – June 2024

\$60,000

\$20,000 Administration, 211 Services, Outreach and Education

\$10,000 Promotion of Covid-19 and other health related community resources at community events or in the event of Disaster related support centers.

\$30,000 Basic Needs direct support for 10-100 residents per year depending on need with no household receiving more than \$1000 in support.

Eligibility: Grants are given one per household to adults 18+ the request must be as a result of Covid-19, or other communicable disease as determined by Tehama County Public Health. Clients are eligible for this assistance one time only. Clients with the following needs are eligible for up to \$1000 per household: Rent/Mortgage, Utilities, Food, Personal Hygiene, Safety supplies (public health), Funding for Transportation to medical appointments, treatments or to care for the individual's basic needs.

Process: Once Tehama Public Health staff have determined the client is eligible, they will complete the referral form and submit it online. UWNC will contact the referring agency if there are any questions. Funding will be available until July 2024 or when the authorized amount is expended.

UWNC will serve as fiscal agent and provide services as outlined, in support of the Covid-19 Equity of Response and Vaccine distribution plans for Tehama County Public Health.

Services will include

1. Assistance with scheduling vaccine appointments through 211. Developing the process and coordinating evolution of vaccine processes with public health.
2. Coordinating with community partner organizations to ensure services reach our identified populations including interpretation and other access services.
3. Expanding Covid-19 Outreach and Education as directed by Public Health to support PH Mobile team and reach identified populations.
4. Informing deployment of the Public Health Mobile team with needs-based data from 211 and other UWNC engagement.
5. Providing training, education and outreach materials regarding UWNC programs and services for the PH Mobile Team.
6. Providing Financial support through the UWNC Covid-19 Basic needs program to in partnership with the Tehama County Public Health Staff. PH team and UWNC will create a mutually beneficial and efficient process to ensure timely delivery of financial support to vulnerable community members in crisis due to Covid.
7. Attending, supporting or developing events in support of Tehama County Public health. This may also include providing Covid-19 information at resources centers that are in response to an emergency or disaster.

We aim to serve the following populations which have been identified based on various vulnerabilities including ethnic groups, social determinants of health, and barriers to accessing care.

- Homeless and at risk of homelessness
- Latinx
- LGBTQ
- Native American and Indigenous
- Undocumented community members
- Agricultural workers
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing
- Low Visual Acuity
