A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF TEHAMA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPTING A STATUTORY EXEMPTION AND APPROVING A GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT (25-01) ADDING REFERENCE TO THE COUNTY'S LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN TO THE COUNTY'S GENERAL PLAN SAFETY ELEMENT

WHEREAS, In 2006 the State adopted Assembly Bill (AB) 2140 which added provisions specifying what is required to be included in a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) and one such requirement is establishing a linkage between a local jurisdiction's LHMP and the Safety Element of their General Plan:

WHEREAS, to comply with said referenced requirement and to be eligible for disaster relief funding per the California Disaster Assistance Act, the County initiated General Plan Text Amendment #25-01 to incorporate the LHMP by reference into the Safety Element of the General Plan;

WHEREAS, the Safety Element incorporates by reference the current Tehama County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, in accordance with the California Government Code Section 65302.6 to increase opportunities for financial assistance under the California Disaster Assistance Act;

WHEREAS, Tehama County is the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the project and has determined that a Statutory Exemption is appropriate for the proposed project;

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Government Code, the Tehama County Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on September 18, 2025, on the proposed General Plan Amendment detailed in Exhibit "A" attached to this resolution.

WHEREAS, during said hearing, the Planning Commission considered said application, the Planning Unit staff report, all comments and evidence submitted into evidence at the hearing, and staffs proposed environmental determination following this hearing the Planning Commission adopted a resolution recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the proposed General Plan Amendment #xx-xx-xx; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Government Code, the Tehama County Board of Supervisors conducted a public hearing on September 30, 2025, on the proposed General Plan Amendment detailed in Exhibit "A" attached to this resolution at which time the Board considered all comments and evidence submitted into the record including County staffs and the Planning Commission's recommendation on the proposed General Plan Amendment #25-01.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Tehama:

1. Finds that the proposed project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Article 5, Section 15061(b)(3) of the Californian Code of Regulations because there is no possibility this project may have a significant effect on the environment.

Local Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) for the County of Tehama planning area was developed in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) and followed FEMA's Local Hazard Mitigation Plan guidance. The LHMP incorporates a process where hazards are identified and profiled, the people and facilities at risk are analyzed, and mitigation actions are developed to reduce or eliminate hazard risk. The implementation of these mitigation actions, which include both short and long-term strategies, involve planning, policy changes, programs, projects, and other activities. (link).

Maintain and periodically update the County's FEMA-approved Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (MJHMP) in coordination with participating jurisdictions. The MJHMP shall guide mitigation planning and investment, support interagency coordination, and be used to inform General Plan updates, development review, and capital improvement planning. Continued maintenance of the MJHMP ensures eligibility for FEMA hazard mitigation assistance programs and supports the County's compliance with AB 2140.
