AMENDMENT #1

TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF TEHAMA AND TEHAMA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

This Amendment #1 to Agreement Number 2021-14 dated 12/10/2020 by and between the County of Tehama, through its Health Services Agency (County) and Tehama County Department of Education (Contractor) for the purpose of Mental Health Student Services Act of 2019 grant collaboration administered through the County and meeting the Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission standards and regulations governing this grant, shall be amended as follows:

3. COMPENSATION

For Contractor's expenditures that are eligible for reimbursement by the Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission for the Mental Health Student Services Act of 2019 grant attached hereto as Exhibit B, Contractor shall submit to County expenditures reports and the County will render payment to the Contractor. Such eligible reimbursements are detailed in Exhibit B. The Maximum Compensation payable under this Agreement shall not exceed \$3,174,751. Contractor shall not be entitled to payment or reimbursement for any tasks or services performed except as specified herein. Contractor shall have no claim against County for payment of any compensation or reimbursement, of any kind whatsoever, for any service provided by Contractor after the expiration or other termination of this Agreement. Contractor shall not be paid any amount in excess of the Maximum Compensation amount set forth above, and Contractor agrees that County has no obligation, whatsoever, to compensate or reimburse Contractor for any expenses, direct or indirect costs, expenditures, or charges of any nature by Contractor that exceed the Maximum Compensation amount set forth above. Should Contractor receive any such payment it shall immediately notify County and shall immediately repay all such funds to County. This provision shall survive the expiration or other termination of this Agreement.

5. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement shall commence on the October 1, 2020, and shall terminate December 31, 2026, unless terminated in accordance with section 6 below.

Exhibit B shall be replaced in its entirety.

Tehama County Department of Education Scope of Work for MHSSA Grant 2020-2024

Location: Tehama County

Contract: \$3,174,751 million dollars over seven years

Grant Distribution: Year 1: \$668,267, Year 2: \$628,882, Year 3: \$745,989, Year 4:

\$754,811, Year 5: \$155,246, Year 6: \$147,315, Year 7: \$74,241.

Definition:

Under the direction of the Grant Coordinator, the following components will be provided under the MHSSA Grant.

Staffing: TCDE will hire (3) School Based Mental Health and Wellness Clinicians, (1) School Based Mental Health and Wellness Coordinator, and (2) Wellness and Behavior Intervention Technicians.

- School Based Mental Health and Wellness Clinician
 - Provide direct mental health and wellness services and programs that foster prosocial skills to students within Tehama county.
 - o May serve as a member of the school intervention team, attend meetings, and provide behavioral support within a multi-tiered intervention framework.
 - o Provide prevention and intervention activities related to increasing mental health awareness, decreasing stigma, and targets of the MHSSA grant.
 - Provide training to students, parents, and staff on mental health, and implement a
 universal screening in coordination with the school-wide systems of social
 emotional support for early identification of students at risk.
 - o Provide individual, group, and/or family counseling services based on referrals.
 - Case management, risk assessment, and referrals as well as documentation and data analysis.
 - o Reports to the School Based Mental Health and Wellness Coordinator.
- School Based Mental Health and Wellness Coordinator
 - Provide coordination and oversight of school based mental health and wellness services.
 - Support Clinicians delivery of mental health services, coordination of prevention and intervention programs, professional development, as well as supervision.
 - o Liaison between schools, districts, and community partners in regard to delivery monitoring, and reporting of data for the MHSSA Grant.
- Wellness and Behavior Intervention Technicians

- o Provide small group skill support at Tehama County school sites.
- o Implement interventions overseen by clinicians
- Case management, risk assessment, and referrals as well as documentation and data analysis.
- Staff and parent training opportunities

Professional Development: Will be coordinated to include training opportunities in alignment with the scope of work while leveraging resources of partners.

Programs & Services:

• The grant will enhance and expand mental health services for children and youth on school campuses and to support agency linkages for ongoing support as appropriate. The scope of work includes direct service, prevention and intervention programs, professional development for school staff, community partners as well as parents. Strategies and evidence-based practices will be implemented to support reducing the stigma of mental health or seeking those services. A yearly Mental Health & Wellness Symposium will be held county wide. Services provided through the MHSSA grant are intended to prevent negative outcomes in the identified targeted populations and to support families within Tehama County. In addition to increase staffing, the grant will support the development on school campuses of Social Emotional Wellness Centers. All services and programs noted are subject to change based on developing needs. The information provided is a summary and a full description of the scope of work is available for review within the grant application.
